

Using the Gender with Age Marker -GAM-

Refugee and Migrants of Venezuela Regional Response Plan 2022

What is the Gender with Age Marker (GAM)?

The Gender with Age Marker (GAM) is a tool designed by the Inter-Agency Standing Committee for Humanitarian Coordination (IASC)¹ to improve gender-equitable programming in response to needs in humanitarian or highly complex contexts.

Why is the use of the GAM important in RMRP planning?

In addition to responding to the principles established in several international frameworks such as the New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants (2016) or the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (2018), the GAM *is a standardized tool to design and implement better projects and to develop capacities for gender mainstreaming, including age and disability*. It is also the only quantitative source of global data that allows the RMRP to have an overall report on its progress in this regard.

The GAM **encourages planning, implementing, and monitoring plans and projects to reflect on the specific needs of the population based on gender, age and/or disability**, and to identify whether the proposed assistance is relevant, responsive, and adapted to the needs and priorities of all population groups.

How does the GAM work?

It is an **online questionnaire** that helps identify needs with a differential view in order to design a more effective response. Based on the information filled in by organizations in the questionnaire, a **score from 0 to 4** is automatically generated indicating:

4: actions are intended to contribute to gender equality across all age groups and/or persons with disabilities;

3: actions intend to contribute to gender equality, but without attention to age groups and/or persons with disabilities;

2: actions intend to address age and/or disability differences, but without attention to gender equality;

1: the actions do not respond to gender, age or disability differences; nor do they address the different needs of specific groups of interest; and

0: the proposal does not incorporate actions.

This tool can be used for project or program design, but also for monitoring. **The RMRP 2022 only addresses design-related elements.** In this way, organizations can identify whether the set of proposed actions incorporates gender equality with age; for example, whether they considered reports, documents, needs assessments that provide differential information.

Below you will find **instructions to apply the Gender with Age Marker**, as well as key considerations and a step-by-step guide. It is recommended to fill out the questionnaire together with your team.

General considerations:

- Please use this guide or the online test-mode to familiarize with the marker.
- Although the word "project" appears throughout the application, the information refers to the **entire set of activities** that your organization will carry out under the RMRP 2022, even if they belong to different sectors or projects within your organization.
- The questionnaire will guide you through the pages to be filled in. Include the general information requested, answer the multiple-choice questions to describe the set of actions you will carry out, and select the gender, age and/or disability groups you will be working with.
- At the end, you will be provided with the **General GAM Code** (a number from 0 to 4) and a **reference number** (e.g. G855221724). Please copy these numbers somewhere you'll remember, since you must include them in the *"RMRP 2022 Submission form"* online questionnaire.
- The platform does not work with Internet Explorer browser. **Please use Chrome or Firefox.**
- At moment, the questionnaire is only available in English.
- If you close before submitting the form (and obtaining the GAM code), you will lose the information you have filled in.
- If you want to return to the immediately previous page, click on the **"back"** option.
- If you select  **"Return to Beginning"**, you will go to the home page. You will not lose the information you have filled in.
- Do not forget to press **"submit"** at the end. You must see the message: **"thank you for participating! You can close this window now"**.
- For RMRP 2022, each organization must initiate the registration of a new project.
- In case you lose or forget your GAM reference number, please send an email to iasc-gam@un.org with your name, organization and location.

Preparation before filling the GAM

The Gender with Age Marker (GAM) is based on twelve Gender Equality Measures (GEMs), a set of indicators on how the gender approach is incorporated in the different stages of any project. Four KEY GEMs are considered in the project design phase.

Through key questions, the GEM scores and some suggested activities. It is important that each organization poses these questions before completing the GAM questionnaire, as they contribute to understanding and adjusting the degree of gender equality of the RMRP submission.

Key question	GEM	Suggested actions
What information and/or data were used to design the activities of this submission?	GEM A - Gender analysis	Conduct a needs analysis based on information that addresses the differentiated needs of men, women, children, adolescents, LGBTIQ+ and/or people with disabilities.
How is this differential perspective incorporated into the proposed actions?	GEM D – Tailored activities	Based on the information obtained, it is important to adapt the activities to the needs and preferences of each group according to gender, age and disability. Targeted actions address the needs and priorities as well as the discrimination faced by specific groups of women/girls/boys/men, such as the indigenous population.
How do the populations participate in the design and review of the activities? How are their suggestions incorporated, overcoming the vision of passive recipients of aid or assistance?	GEM G – Influence on the Project	Propose different mechanisms or strategies for the identified groups of people to participate and even influence the design or review of activities.
What do we do well and what should we change?	GEM J - Benefits	Create a mechanism to inform if there are distinct benefits for women/girls and/or men/boys in different age groups as a result of activities adapted to different needs or barriers.

1. Registration

- Select the option: "I'm registering a new project and I don't have a reference number".
- "Test or practice only" you can use this option to become familiar with the platform.

3.4. GAM relevance

- If you consider that the gender approach with age is **not** relevant in your RMRP 2022 activities submission, you must check all 3 boxes and "next".
- In this way, the system automatically finishes the process and issues this message: **GAM Code: N/A**
